Metropolitan Nektarios of Corfu & Saint Spyridon's Slipper

On Thursday, April 27, we were blessed with a visit from his Eminence Metropolitan Nektarios of the Holy Metropolis of Corfu, Paxi & the Diapontian Islands in Greece. His Eminence brought with him a slipper worn by St. Spyridon, who is the patron saint of his bishopric and whose blessed body remains there incorrupt. Following theological studies at the school of Theology of Athens University, he entered the Holy Monastery of Ano Xemias, was ordained Presbyter and Archimandrite in

1979 and became its Abbot in 1986.

A prolific author of articles, monographs and devotional texts, Metropolitan Nektarios is an archieratical member of the synodical committee on monastic life. His Eminence was enthroned as Metropolitan of Ker-

kyra, Paxoi, and the Transmarine Islands on October 11, 2002.

That evening His Eminence presided over a special vespers service attended by many visiting clergy and parishioners from the surrounding area in addition to our own faithful from Saint Mark. At the end of the service His Eminence presented the slippers to those in attendance for veneration. Then, in a surprising and equally humbling gesture, Metropolitan Nektarios offered the blessed relic to remain at Saint Mark peremanently for the edification of all future generartions! The Metropolitan concluded the evening commenting on the beauty of not only our sanctuary, but of our people as well. His Eminence greatly appreciated the warm welcome extended to him by the Saint Mark family. We in return are greatly honored to have been able to worship with His Eminence Metropolitan Nektarios. Furthermore, we are in awe of being entrusted as stewards of this divine piece of our Orthodox Christian heritage. Plans are already underway on how to best preserve and readily present this significant relic to the believers here at Saint Mark.

Spyridon was born in the village of Ashia, Cyprus (270 AD). He was a peasant farmer and shepherd and was not educated. Spyridon was married and had a daughter, Irene. After his wife died, he

and his daughter both entered into monasticism. He later became the Bishop

of Trimythous (during the reign of Constantine the Great) and continued in piety for which he was greatly known.

Spyridon was exiled at the end of the third century during the persecutions of Maximilian. In

325 AD, he was present at the First Ecumenical Council of Nicea where he astonished many with his simple, yet profoundly accurate explanations of the Orthodox Faith. Though not well-educated, he surprised everyone at the Council of Nicea by converting many of the Arian heretics to Orthodox. He explained the unity and diversity of the Trinity by holding up a brick, then commonly thought to be a combination of the elements fire, earth and water; as he spoke, fire blazed from the top of the brick while water gushed out underneath. There too, at Nicea, he met Saint Nicholas of Myra, with whom he formed a lasting friendship. Saint Spyridon reposed in 348 AD in Cyprus, and was buried in the Church of the Holy Apostles in Trimythous.

During the month of April the Saint Mark YouTube Channel was visited by people living in 21 countries outside of the United States (including Greece, Canada, Australia, Philippines, Brazil, India, Germany, Mexico, Ukraine, South Africa, and many others)! Viewers here in the U.S. logged in from 25 states ranging from Florida to Oregon. De-

mographically speaking, we're reaching all adult age groups *(as you can see in the graph above)*. While we more young adults (ages 25-34) are tuning in than middle-aged viewers, our largest audience by far are the 65+ year old viewers! In fact, over half of our viewers are over the age of 55. This proves that this technological advancement isn't just a young person's interest, but a vital ministry that serves all people. Futhermore, this data shows that this service is helping us connect to our elderly and homebound believers who have physical difficulty attending our services.

About 103 households viewed the services on Sunday April 23rd (the week after Pascha), and roughly 75 households logged in the following week (April 30th). Just imagine 100 extra families in attendance for a Sunday service, in addition to the 600 parishioners

who are worshipping in person!

Yet, despite all our growth, there's still work to be done. We need EVERYONE to SUBSCRIBE to the Saint Mark Channel on YouTube! There is no subscription fee. Once we have surpassed 100 subscribers we can apply for a custom YouTube address (such as www.YouTube.com/SaintMark). We currently have 77 subscribers. We are also hoping to further enhance our broadcasts with two additional HD cameras. The Greek Festival: An Opportunity for Mission and Outreach!

he word "Ministry" comes from the Greek word diakoneo, meaning "to serve". Our Pastors spend their lives in ministry but are not the only ones called into the Lord's service. We as the Laity also have a responsibility to obey the Lord's commands and follow His examples to bring others to Him. Our priests, Fr. Mark and Fr. Steven, appealed to parishioners to join them in a formalized Outreach Ministry Committee to explore ways to increase the witness of our Faith.

A group of us took up the challenge. We held our first meeting just one week prior to our annual Greek Festival 2017. Two big questions arose: "Are we as Orthodox Christian believers equipped to spread the Word?" We at St. Mark in Boca Raton replied with a resounding "YES". And, "What is the thing we want to be known for as Ortho-

dox Christians?" We wanted to change the outside perception in our community of being "the church with the Greek festival". It was decided that our annual Greek Festival offers us a great opportunity to do this and to shine a light upon our Orthodox Christian faith. We left the meeting with the decision to sponsor an Outreach Booth at the upcoming Greek Festival. This would be in addition to our already established Church Tours, lectures by our Clergy, and a Saturday evening Vespers service during the Festival.

HERE IS HOW WE GOT STARTED: We had to determine where the Outreach Booth might reach the most people. Why not in the Vendor Area, a popular place for festival-goers? What materials should we place on our tables in order to entice passers-by to stop and look? A list of books and materials which we found attracted us and educated us to Eastern

Orthodox Christianity, was created. Our bookstore was scoured for books, more were ordered, and various pamphlets, brochures, and other handout materials that are kept at the Church regarding our Orthodox Christian ministries were gathered. An important next step was to create a schedule of volunteer workers to 'man' the booth. It was necessary to find workers who would be comfortable and knowledgeable to share their love of Jesus Christ with others, and the basics of Orthodox Christianity. **HERE IS HOW WE SET UP:** The attention of passersby was captured with an attractively organized table which held a display of materials which included newsletters, pamphlets and "give-aways" like pens, refrigerator magnets, and bookmarks from OCMC, IOCC, and Orthodox Prison Ministry to name a few; and there were introductory books, pamphlets, and handouts on Eastern Orthodox Christianity. The Gospel, a censor and a cross were placed on the table. Four large Icons provided a background. Although we did not have an audio/visual display, we would recommend having information available in that format.

A large banner and posters to advertise our church tours was hung on the front of the display table. Business cards about our Introduction to Orthodoxy Class were handed out. Forms for visitors and new inquirers that are used at St. Mark were placed on the table for those

> who were seeking more information. The Church Tours and Lectures were promoted by booth workers as well as by all our Festival booth volunteers. Minimal fees were charged for books, or we asked for a small donation, or gave them away to serious inquirers.

> **HERE IS WHAT WE LEARNED:** There was an overwhelming positive response by visitors/inquirers to our beautiful Sanctuary, the Lectures and our Outreach Booth. Two things in particular are noteworthy for success: friendliness (i.e. a welcoming attitude), and the availability of priests (retired also), to answer inquirers' theological questions which were many. We also noted that there are many lapsed Orthodox within our community who need encouragement to come back to the Church.

HERE ARE SOME OF OUR RESULTS IN JUST A FEW SHORT MONTHS: A small number of inquirers from the Festival are attending the Introduction to Orthodoxy Class. Our Church community was very positive, supportive and encouraging of this endeavor. It is still too soon to know what the far reaching effects of this Outreach might produce.

We are striving to be a recognizable voice in the community. May we be a catalyst for other Orthodox Churches to replicate this Ministry. Why not adapt and customize this outreach in your community at festival time? Let's keep in touch and compare results.

building the diakonia retreat center PANAGIA CHAPEL

ROOF TILES CAMPAIGN

The Panagia Chapel at the Diakonia Retreat Center is in its final stages. The next and one of the very last steps is the tiling for the exterior sides and for the roof.
